Respectful dialogue ↑

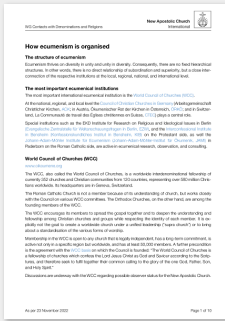
The New Apostolic Church and its members respect the religious practices of other people, and refrain from making derogatory remarks. They endeavour to have a good and peaceable relationship on the basis of mutual respect. The Church rejects any kind of religious fanaticism.

The Apostles were and are given by Jesus Christ for His entire church. This encourages the New Apostolic Church to foster an increased dialogue with other Christian denominations. In a pluralistic society, the New Apostolic Church participates in interdenominational dialogue in order to jointly represent Christian values and deepen mutual understanding.

The New Apostolic Church is open to the ecumenical movement. The motto of this collaboration is: unity in a reconciled diversity that preserves the identity of the respective churches. All ecumenical contacts always revolve around Jesus as the mediator and principal focus. Since the 2000s, the Church has been increasingly represented in ecumenical bodies.

The New Apostolic Church actively cultivates good neighbourly relations with other churches and denominations at the local level. This is primarily accomplished by way of invitations to special events and through benefit events for charitable purposes.
