The main theme of the afternoon was: The fire of the gospel must always be kindled again and again; it shall never be extinguished but always keep burning (see Luke 12:49).

In the evening the local Nan congregation welcomed the Chief Apostle and the many guests for a festive congregational fellowship and great joy was evident.

Today, Monday the journey of the Chief Apostle continues to Australia. On Wednesday and Sunday he will celebrate the Divine Services in Adelaide and Brisbane.

2009 brought a great change in Asia. On 19th January 2009 Chief Apostle Leber served in Yogyakarta, Indonesia. District Apostle Tansahtikno retired. The new Regional Church South East Asia was created and Urs Hebeisen ordained as District Apostle. The district includes Indonesia, Philippines and many other countries of South-East Asia.

Thailand is a very challenging country for Christian missions, the District Apostle Hebeisen states. Thai people are very friendly, not wrong at all it is called "The Land of smiles". However different traditions and cultural understanding are often hard to understand for foreigners. But still the work will continue, as he says: "Evangelization, we have not given up."
